Mentor Requirements

Participate in 60 minute "mentor" orientation.

Interact with mentee on a weekly basis to provide support, encouragement and advice in a safe, supportive environment.

Provide opportunities for mentee to gain new skills, interests and expand their experience beyond their families, schools and neighborhoods.

Document mentee/mentor interactions and hours in a monthly log, and submit documentation to Mentor Coach for review.

Mentor Qualifications

Must be 21 years old with a drivers license and proof of insurance.

Must meet all screening requirements, including reference checks, and a thorough background check.

Experience serving as a mentor or in other youth development capacity preferred, but not required.

Strong interpersonal/communication skills.

Creativity and flexibility are essential in assuming the role of Adult Mentor

Experience working with socio-economically diverse urban communities preferred.

Mentoring Matters

Benefits of Mentoring:

Mentoring, when used as a strategy, works in helping young people succeed in life. It also helps give young people the confidence, resources and skills they need to reach their potential. A quality, enduring mentoring relationship with a caring adult can be a promising intervention for children of prisoners (mentees).

A 1995 study of Big Brothers/Big Sisters showed that after 18 months, mentored youth were less likely than non-mentored youth to begin using drugs and alcohol and to initiate violence. Mentored youth were also more likely to have improved their school attendance and performance, their attitudes toward completing schoolwork and their peer and family relationships.
